The Original Story

READING: Original Story

- First reactions are really important
- As a playwright, you need to remember...
 - What stands out to you?
 - What excites you about this story?

The World

- For me, the first thing that stands out is the scale
- Ducks are small, so the world is massive to them
 - Reeds becomes like trees, a pond would be a lake, a lake an ocean
- It's also beautiful and green and sunny
- This is a fun and bright world

The Characters

• The second thing that stands out to me are the animals



- Sounds silly, but this instantly takes us to another world
- This is a world of cartoons and fables
 - We know it's going to be child-friendly story
- Animals have their own individual traits and associations...
- Wise owl, sneaky fox and so on
- There's a lot to play with
 - Can have a lot of fun with the characters
